

Literacy

We will be putting all our set 1 sounds to use in our writing this term. We start with books off with Supertato, looking at people who help us, healthy foods and then move into the traditional tale, Jack and the Beanstalk which will also include lots of non-fiction.

In phonics, many of us will learn to recognise the RWI set 2 sounds and begin to read and write words with these in.

Maths

We will be building a strong number sense to 5, looking at comparing numbers, composition to 5 and number bonds. We extend our number knowledge to 10, combine groups with these numbers and build up to learning bonds to 10 from memory.

We will also be comparing mass and capacity. We will look at 3D shapes and continue work on patterns.

Religion

We learn about different celebrations, our local church and the Eucharist. After half term we will learn about the Easter Story. We will also learn about other religions and events such as Chinese New Year and Judaism.

PSHE

We will be working on solving conflicts appropriately and thinking about our ambitions.

Computing and E-safety

We will continue to document our learning and the work that we are proud of by using our electronic journal; Seesaw. We will take photographs learning the importance of being sensible as these pictures are going online to our teachers and parents.

We will use simple software to draw, type and play games online.

Physical Development

We will continue to build our finger strength through daily dough disco sessions and use weekly activities to support our fine motor skills.

Our gross motor skills we continue to be developed through the outdoors but also our weekly PE sessions from our Manchester United Coach. In these lessons we will be working on particular skills.

Homework

Children need to read (or carry out a reading activity) daily, where possible. Reading activities can include reading their book, library book or using the phonics flashcards. Handwriting, phonics and maths homework will also be set weekly.

Understanding of the world— Science

We will be learning all about different roles in the community, comparing our surroundings and learning to take care of our environment, growth and change through plants and living eggs.

Wider Curriculum

We will be creating art linked to superheroes and plants and growth, using a variety of materials such as natural materials, pastels and water colour paints. We will continue to use Churanga for music and learn some performance songs.
