As we celebrate 'World Book Week' as a school we are focusing on the author 'William Shakespeare'. In Year 2 we are going to retell the first part of the story 'Midsummers Night Dream.'

Following this, the children will be focusing on adding different suffixes to root words such as -ment, -ness, -less and -ly. Another focus this term is for the children to independently expand their sentences using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions.

Maths

This term we are going to explore multiplication and division. Following this we will focus on identifying fractions of a shape and a number. To end the term, we will begin learning about time where we will focus on o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.

Religion

In RE we will be looking at reconciliation where we will explore the story of the Last Supper. We will also be learning all about the importance and purpose of Lent.

PSHE

In RSE this term we will continue exploring our relationships with others and build upon the understanding that we have been created out of love and for love. We will look at strategies for developing healthy relationships and keeping safe.

Computing and E-safety

We are zoologists!

The children will be collecting, gathering and presenting data about bugs.

E -safety

We will be focusing on raising the children's awareness about private information.

PE

In PE, the children will be focusing on developing their catching, throwing and bowling techniques which can then be applied in striking and fielding games.
